The Campus Organizer will work with their fellow students to take action to bring about equality for women in Wisconsin. This position offers the opportunity to gain valuable organizing experience with the Wisconsin chapter of the largest organization of feminist activists in the country.

**Reports To:** Executive Director

**Responsibilities:**

- Work with Executive Director to develop and implement a grassroots organizing plan and establish goals relating to that plan including but not limited to: measurable outcomes, appropriate data tracking, volunteer recruitment and retention, trainings for activists and volunteer leadership development.
- Work with students, faculty, staff, and appropriate student and community groups to generate interest in crucial issues and to establish a WI NOW presence on campus
- Plan for and implement campus-based events
- Conduct educational outreach activities about relevant issues on campus including, but not limited to: tabling events, job/volunteer fairs, campus rallies, etc.
- Perform other duties as they arise

**Qualifications:**

- Strong commitment to women's rights and equality and knowledge of WI NOW's mission and goals
- Knowledge and understanding of campus life, active student organizations, and university policies regarding campus organizing or activism
- Ability to prioritize and handle a variety of projects simultaneously
- Ability to produce concrete results with off-site supervision
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills

**Details:**

This internship begins in January and lasts until the end of the academic year unless the applicant wishes to extend the position through the summer. The organizer is asked to dedicate at least 10 hours a week to the position. Internships with WI NOW are an excellent way to build your resume while gaining valuable experience with a non-profit advocacy organization. WI NOW will work with the university to ensure academic credit if possible.
